Acquired in 2006, the Brandon production facility employs approximately 210 people in the fields of engineering, operations and maintenance and handles the following products:

- Ammonia – A compound used in the production of fertilizer and for industrial purposes. Shipped by truck and rail.
- UAN – A liquid nitrogen fertilizer. Shipped by truck and rail.
- Granular Urea – A solid fertilizer with high nitrogen content. Shipped by truck and rail.
- Ammonium Polyphosphate – A liquid fertilizer produced with anhydrous ammonia and phosphoric acid. Shipped by truck and rail.
- Ammonium Thiosulfate – A liquid fertilizer that contains nitrogen and sulfur. Shipped by truck and rail.

Koch Fertilizer Canada, ULC invests millions annually into the Brandon facility to make it a more safe, reliable and rewarding place to work. A strong emphasis on customer focus and satisfying customer needs in a fluid marketplace has allowed this facility to grow and prosper.
