General Information

Built in 1974, the Enid production facility became a Koch Nitrogen Company, LLC site in 2003. The site employs approximately 130 people in the fields of engineering, operations and maintenance and handles the following products:

- Ammonia – A gaseous compound used in the production of fertilizer and for industrial purposes. Shipped by truck, rail and pipeline.
- UAN – A liquid nitrogen fertilizer. Shipped by truck and rail.
- Granular Urea – A solid fertilizer with high nitrogen content. Shipped by truck and rail.

Koch Nitrogen has recently invested \$20 million into modernization projects to make this facility a more safe, reliable and rewarding place to work. A strong emphasis on customer focus and satisfying customer needs in a fluid marketplace has allowed the business to grow and prosper. The most recent addition is a new 10,000-square-foot control facility that will require less energy and water while enhancing plant efficiency and operational reliability.
